#### **Overview**

The IEA Global Conference is the flagship international event on energy efficiency, providing a forum for ministers, CEOs and other thought leaders to drive action on energy efficiency. The 10th edition of this internationally recognised event will be the most significant that the IEA has held to date, with a key focus on implementing the COP28 goal of doubling energy efficiency progress this decade.

The Conference is being co-hosted by the IEA Executive Director **Dr Fatih Birol** and the European Commissioner for Energy and Housing **Dan Jørgensen**, in Brussels on the 12 and 13 June 2025, in partnership with the Energy Efficiency Movement.

The event builds on the success of the IEA's Global Conferences in Versailles and Nairobi, which each provided opportunities for over 600 people from every part of the world, including ministers from over 40 governments and a wide range of CEOs to build momentum for action on energy efficiency.
