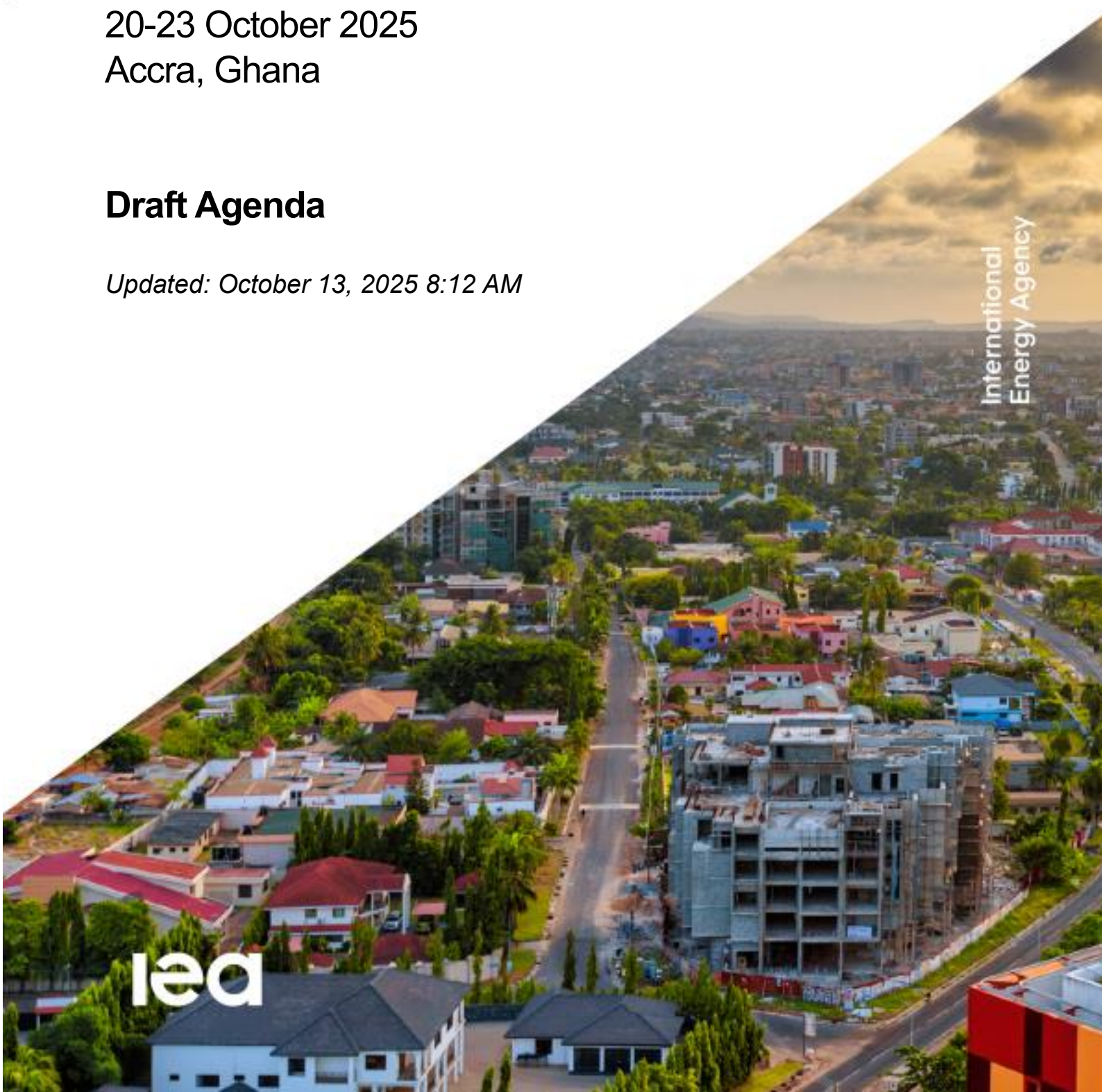

## About the IEA

The International Energy Agency (IEA) works with policy makers and stakeholders to scale up action on energy to mitigate climate change, improve energy security and grow economies while delivering environmental and social benefits.

## Energy Efficiency in Emerging Economies (E4) Programme

The IEA has supported governments of major emerging economies in advancing energy efficiency policies and programmes through the Energy Efficiency in Emerging Economies Programme (E4 Programme) since 2014. E4 works closely with six of the largest emerging economies - Brazil, China, India, Indonesia, Mexico and South Africa - as well as within regions, such as Southeast Asia, Latin America and Africa, with the aim to accelerate energy efficiency.

How we work:

- **Policy development.** We support the development of national strategies, targets, policies, regulations and monitoring systems.
- **Research and analysis.** We provide customised research and analysis to support and inform the decision-making of emerging economy officials responsible for energy efficiency policy.
- **Thematic workshops.** We bring together officials and experts from a range of countries to explore key topics and generate practical, locally applicable solutions.
- **Capacity building.** We provide training for officials and future leaders, primarily through the E4 Training Weeks and a series of online, self-paced courses.

Since 2014, the E4 Programme has collaborated with partner country governments on all aspects of their clean energy transitions with support from a range of donors including Canada, Denmark, the European Commission, Germany, Italy, Japan, Sweden, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom.

## Energy Efficiency Policy in Training Week

The Energy Efficiency Policy Training Week is the flagship energy efficiency training event of the International Energy Agency. The training aims to build capacity among policy makers equipping them with knowledge and skills to develop and implement effective energy efficiency initiatives in their countries.

Since 2015, the IEA's Energy Efficiency Policy Training Weeks have equipped more than 3,000 government officials from over 125 countries with the tools and knowledge to implement effective energy efficiency policies. These training weeks are organised by the IEA's Office of Energy Efficiency and Inclusive Transitions.

This regional event represents a unique opportunity for policy makers to learn from international best practice and foster a truly international community of energy efficiency practitioners, helping them to advance the goal of doubling energy efficiency by 2030 while improving people's lives.
