Clubs beware....



- Double-counting at national level (additionality of club member achievements?)
- UNFCCC or other external assessment of environmental integrity and sustainability of club units transferred
- National Government authorisation requirements
- Eligibility of club transactions against national compliance obligations
- Political distaste for international offsetting



- Developed countries will have to pay for a large share of developing country mitigation
- More than is comfortable if simply added to an ambitious NDC total
- So we need an NDC offset system (no double-counting, and no nonsense about "indulgences")
- More than is financeable/optimal via direct or indirect tax-funded aid transfers
- So we need modalities for incentivising purchase of international mitigation by private entities
- Either way, there must be universal rules on environmental integrity and sustainability of units offset or purchased or could this break the Paris system?
