Why international classifications



- Improve the availability and quality of production and trade statistics world wide
- Data harmonization across countries and different statistical domains
- Improve comparability of data over time

HARMONIZED SYSTEM (HS)




- Developed by WCO
- International products classification system for trade
- 153 contracting parties
- over 98% of the merchandise in international trade is classified in HS
- Almost all countries use it for statistical and administrative purposes
- Review once every five years (...2007, 2012, 2017...)



HS Review Process (Structure)





FAO is an observer member of the HS Committee and of the HS RSC

HS Review Process: Proposals



Provide justification and evidence:

- Rationale
- Identification criteria: descriptions and photos
- Trade data: threshold USD 50 million (6-digit) and USD 100 million (4-digit)

- IWG on Forest Products Statistics drafted the proposal
- UNECE member states were consulted
- FAO submitted the proposal
- FAO, ITTO and UNECE attended the meetings to defend

Purposes:

Better alignment between HS and IWG statistical need

IWG proposal for HS 2017 Revision: Results



- As of September 2015, all items of the proposal are approved and endorsed by WCO
- Some will be legally-binding from Jan. 2017
- The rest will come into force from Jan. 2018



IWG proposal for HS 2017 Revision: Summary



- We're more proactive in the process
- Collaborations with member states, partner organizations, and other departments are critical for the success
- Classification on forest products is improving
- A continuous improvement process: HS 2022 Revision




CPC Version 2.1 Review



- Custodian: UNSD
- Review cycle: every 5 years
- The Expert Group on International Classifications (EG): developing a strategy for the convergence of international classifications
- The group meets at least every 2 years and reports to the United Nations Statistical Commission (UNSC) following each meeting
- Specific technical, analytical or exploratory tasks are carried out by Technical Subgroups (TSG) of the Expert Group
- Members of the EG: International Organizations, countries, custodians, major users, and experts





FAO Proposal for CPC Version 2.1 Review: Forest Products



- 21 new 5-digit code for forest products
- Add details at the 5-digit level (C/NC)
- Better harmonization with HS
- 5 related to energy (fuelwood-C/NC, wood pellets, other agglomerated wood waste, non-agglomerated)



FAO Proposal for CPC Version 2.1 Review: Forest Products



- Submitted to EG by FAO in 2011
- As of September 2015, all items of the proposal are officially endorsed
- Correspondence to HS 2007 updated
- Explanatory notes updated



What can be done



- Wood waste used for fuel is not separated from other wood waste
- Potential products to separate: briquettes, torrefied wood pellets
