CCS Roadmap regulatory actions and milestones

2009 IEA CCS Roadmap recommends

- Existing legal and regulatory frameworks should be reviewed and adapted for CCS demonstration by 2011 in OECD countries and by 2015 in all non-OECD countries with CCS potential
- All countries should have a legal and regulatory framework suitable for large-scale CCS deployment by 2020

International legal issues need to be resolved by 2012

Includes enabling transboundary CO₂ transfer under the 1996 London Protocol



2011 Clean Energy Ministerial

- Carbon Capture, Use and Storage Action Group
- 8 recommendations to 2011 CEM
- Highlight raising awareness of international marine treaty amendments as key issue

Options for enabling transboundary CO2 transfer

- 5 potential options under international law
- London Protocol governed by international rules of treaty interpretation
 - 1969 Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties
 - Precedents and commentaries
- Explicit carve out for EOR projects

CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE

Five potential options

- 1. General rule of interpretation
- 2. Provisional application of amendment
- 3. Subsequent agreement (bilateral or multilateral)

- 4. Modification of operation of London Protocol
- 5. Suspension of operation of London Protocol

CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE



Conclusions

- Number of options pending entry into force of 2009 amendment
- Provisional application by agreement of Contracting Parties appears to be best option
- Interpretative resolution desirable but unlikely
- Where Contracting Parties can't reach agreement
 - Subsequent bilateral/ multilateral agreement
 - Modification or suspension of Article 6 to extent prohibits CO2 export
- IEA presented options to London Protocol contracting parties at their 6th meeting (London, 18-19 October)
