Three strategic goals:

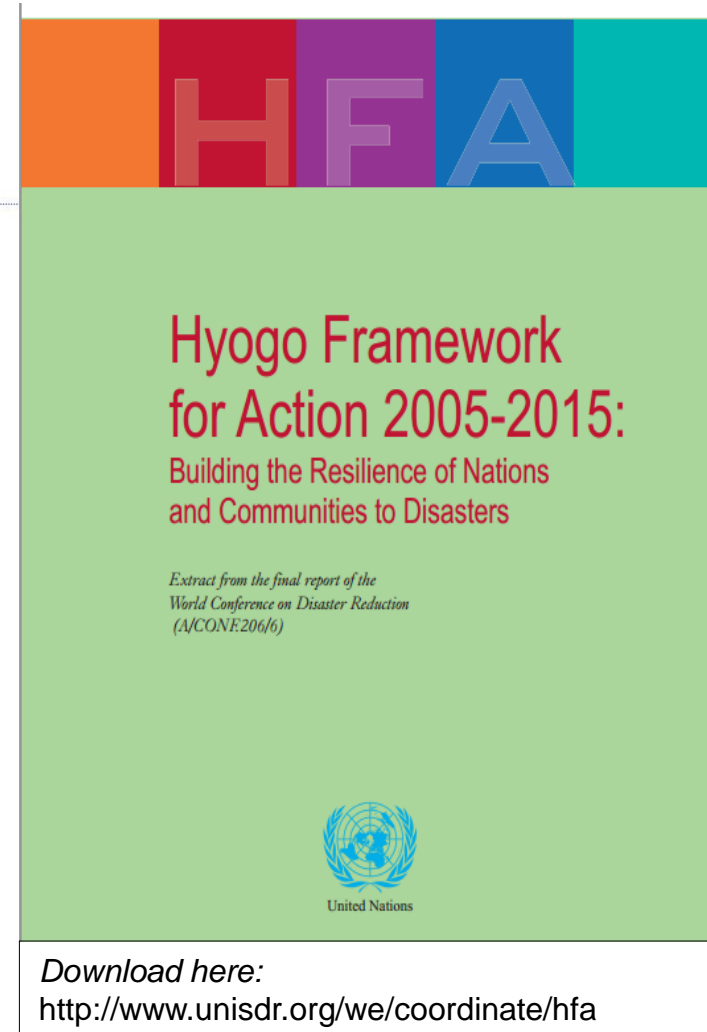
- *Mainstream risk reduction into development.*
- *Strengthen institutional capacity.*
- *Incorporate risk reduction into emergency preparedness, response and recovery.*

Five priorities for action:

- *Ensure institutional basis for implementation.*
- *Consistently identify and assess risk.*
- *Stimulate risk awareness and knowledge.*
- *Reduce underlying risk factors.*
- *Strengthen preparedness.*

One outcome:

- *Reduce disaster losses in lives, and social and environmental assets.*



Status of HFA implementation

- **Downward trend in mortality risk** due to enhanced capacities in early warning, preparedness and response.
- **But the cost of damage continues to increase.**
 - Increasing losses are associated with an increase in **exposure** and growing **extensive risk**.
 - **The framework needs to address drivers of risk** to halt increase of losses.

- ☐ Financing – focus on effectiveness of existing financial flows and investments

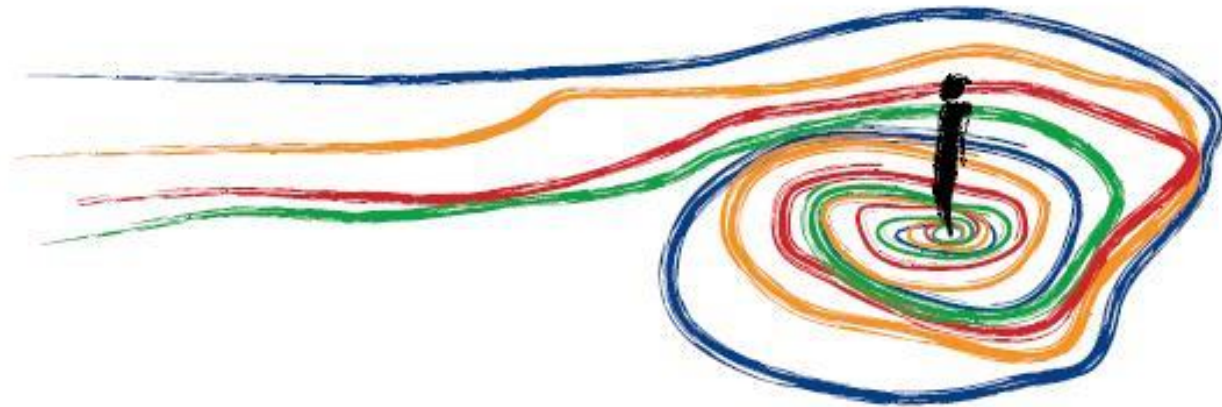
