
# **Regional barriers**

- Rapid energy demand growth
- Low institutional capacity
- Subsidized energy
- Low private sector EE capacity
- For energy-importing countries (Jordan, Tunisia), energy price volatility and supply disruption issues
- Low capacity for manufacturing, servicing or testing energy efficient products
- Demanding climactic conditions
- Capital and spending constraints



# **Cross-sectoral policies**

- 1. Establish energy data collection capacity
- 2. Develop national energy efficiency plans
- 3. Facilitate private investment
- 4. Establish lead energy efficiency institutions
- 5. Progressively address energy price subsidies





## Buildings

- 6. Mandatory energy efficiency building codes
- 7. Encourage energy efficient building renovations
- 8. Encourage use of high-efficiency building components





# **Appliances and equipment**

- 9. Minimum energy performance standards for appliances
- 10. Monitoring,verification andenforcement ofstandards





### Lighting
