Regional barriers

- **Rapid energy demand growth**
- **Low institutional capacity**
- **Subsidized energy**
- **Low private sector EE capacity**
- **For energy-importing countries (Jordan, Tunisia), energy price volatility and supply disruption issues**
- **Low capacity for manufacturing, servicing or testing energy efficient products**
- **Demanding climactic conditions**
- **Capital and spending constraints**

Cross-sectoral policies

1. Establish energy data collection capacity
2. Develop national energy efficiency plans
3. Facilitate private investment
4. Establish lead energy efficiency institutions
5. Progressively address energy price subsidies

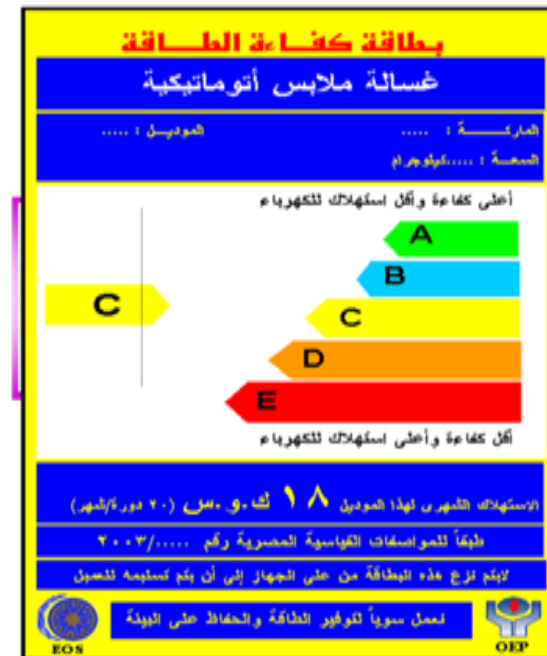

- 12.** High-efficiency street lighting



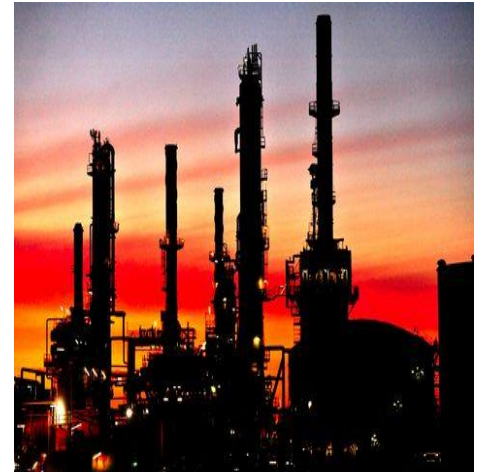
Transport
