

Why energy efficiency policies?






- To capture the beneficial effects of energy efficiency for:

Government policies help overcome the barriers to energy efficiency




Consumer awareness, low energy prices, access to financing, and implementation capacity are the most common barriers cited by governments

Strategies and Action Plans	Using the Strategy Development process to build consensus & mobilize action
Funding mechanisms	General fiscus, energy bills, or carbon tax revenues?

Stakeholder engagement	Engaging consumers and civil society on energy efficiency drivers
Public-private sector cooperation	How to engage the private sector Is the Energy Efficiency Accord viable?
International assistance	Coordinating technical assistance Coordinating SOP with the Clean Investment Plan
